The Year in Review

The highlight of 2013 for Women, Food and Agriculture Network was the opportunity to host the 4th National Conference for Women in Sustainable Agriculture, Nov. 6 – 8 in Des Moines, IA.

This conference brought 400 women engaged in healthy food and farming from all over the US and several other countries to the heart of the Midwest, for two and a half days of networking, learning, enjoying locally sourced food, and visiting a variety of farms and rural businesses on one of the many field tours.

One participant wrote: "Throughout my career I have attended many conferences and workshops but this conference was very organized, I learned something new from each presentation I attended and the tours

were all educational, fun, and wonderful food."

Another said: "I wanted to let the organizers know that this was a healing experience for me. I just closed my small localowned business, it was very heartbreaking and being able to discuss issues with other women about their experiences was priceless. Owning a business and working in a 'man's world' as a woman can be intimidating and



frustrating at times. However the encouragement and compassion from other women, the experiences and heartbreaks shared, the advice, the stories, the support was priceless."

Many attendees listed a variety of actions they plan to take as a result of the conference, including becoming more active politically and finding more women farmers and advocates in their communities to network with.

WFAN's board of directors made plans for the executive director transition that took place in mid-2014. Staff members continued to work with WFAN's key programs – Harvesting Our Potential (for aspiring and beginning women farmers), Women Caring for the Land (for female landowners) and Plate to Politics (for healthy food and farming advocates).




